Predestined: A Vision Coming to Light

The vision that God showed Pastor Jennings and what he endured

How many people do you know can say God showed them a vision and you are witnessing it come to pass? Pastor Jennings has spoken many times about visions that God has allowed him to see and prophecies that have and are coming to pass.

We have also heard him say how glad he will be once we move upstairs into the main sanctuary, but on Sunday, August 29th (evening service broadcast), Pastor shocked everyone when he told the congregation and viewers "I already been upstairs over 40 years ago."

To someone who does not understand prophecy and seeing visions fulfilled, it might sound ridiculous. How did you see this over 40 years ago? He went on to tell us how God showed him this present work around the age of 15. One of the things he shared was God showed him in a dream that he saw rooftops of ancient buildings and the sound of him preaching the word of God in a particular place and how distinct the sound was.

Pastor Jennings said it was not until he went to the temple (present location) to meet with the contractors after which he walked and spoke to God, then came back into the sanctuary that God brought the vision back to his remembrance.

Pastor Jennings stated the only thing that kept him from backsliding was the vision that God showed him and his faithfulness to God and in God. Pastor said that God himself tutored him day and night, teaching him how to harmonize the scriptures, Old Testament and New Testament.

In my searching, I dabbled into Oneness, Trinitarians, Islam, etc. On one memorable occasion, I stumbled on a false prophet called Pastor Smith, whose entire message criticized and undermined the teachings of Pastor Gino Jennings. The daily routine of waking up at 7 a.m. each morning and working until 3 p.m. staring at a screen for most of the day had become the new “normal.” When summer eventually came around, it was a big relief and a welcomed break from school. My summer was enjoyable since I was able to go to New Jersey and New York.

Summer has passed, school is back in session, and I was surprisingly excited to go back. The first day was great. Like many other first days back at school, I was filled with anticipation and looking forward to being reunited with friends. We were issued new “transpasses” and Chromebooks for the upcoming school year. Surprisingly, some classes still require us to bring books and pencils, so we are still expected to write!

Like everywhere in public, we are required to wear masks all day except during lunch break. Each classroom has an air purifier, and we are required to wipe down our tables with disinfection wipes after each class. In reality, there is not much social distancing; since the classrooms are small, you are always sitting relatively close to someone else.
