



THIS IS THE SECOND PHASE OF THE VISION: SELF SUFFICIENCY

In a jam-packed auditorium at the Koury Convention Center in December 2022, Pastor Gino Jennings thoroughly outlined the second phase of the vision that God gave him.

Before the end-of-year services gathering in Greensboro, N.C., Jennings hinted at the direction that the First Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ was going. He has made it abundantly clear that he envisions the church becoming a self-sustaining entity.

Where there is a vision from God, there is a mission from God, Jennings said to preface his message to the congregation.

"I will never forget where God brought us, and you should never lose focus on where you're headed," Jennings declared in his opening remarks of the message recorded on Dec. 30, 2022.

When I look at what God [has] done and is

doing, He's fulfilling the vision that I have been telling people for years."

Jennings began the message by laying out a timeline of how God dealt with him. He detailed when the Lord first appeared to him when he was 15 years old, which was about 45 years ago.

As a young adult, when Jennings went on a seven-day fast, God first spoke to him concerning the present, visible work of the organization he shared.

God's work is conducted and guided by a vision, Jennings accentuated, frequently quoting Proverbs 29:18 ("Where there is no vision, the people perish...") as a guiding principle for his message.

Through Pastor Jennings' personal experiences as a visionary and overseer, he has learned patience and endurance, among several other valuable lessons that have led to overwhelming success.

"Vision lays the foundation, and vision gives the plan for the work," he continued before expounding upon another familiar passage of scripture in Habakkuk 2 that says to "Write the vision and make it plain."


"There are benefits to following God, and I am reaping those benefits."

Koury Convention Center's auditorium, which holds 5,000 or so occupants, "can't even hold the vision," Jennings told the audience.

First Church's diverse membership consists of medical professionals, financial experts, entrepreneurs, transportation industry professionals, academic professionals, media practitioners and industry leaders from various sectors of the corporate world.

The Truth of God followership also comprises many nationalities, languages and cultural backgrounds.

Greetings, my name is Antoinette Morrison, and my food blog is @Soulfoodmorrison on Instagram.

This is one of my special and favorite sauces to make and eat. The idea is from my former job at Patsy Lyn Caterers where I worked for 7 years, and I added my own additions and tweaks to it. Though it's a barbeque sauce, it's even better to make Jamaican Barbie Fried Chicken, which is fried chicken coated in barbeque sauce and then placed in the oven. You can do your regular fried chicken wings (or any part) with your usual recipe before coating with the sauce.

The recipe is as follows:





Ginger Garlic Barbeque Sauce

- √ 1 tbsp mustard
- ✓ 2 cups ketchup
- √ 2 tbsp fish and meat sauce
- √ 1/2 to 3/4 cup brown sugar (according to sweet preference)
- √ 5 pegs grated garlic
- ✓ Hot sauce (amount used is according to the individual's heat tolerance level)
- √ 1 knob grated ginger (n.b. more or less used also helps determine heat level)

Directions

- Whisk all ingredients until combined. You should see specks of ginger and garlic which adds a nice feel to the fried chicken.
- Coat cooled fried chicken wings (you can use fish or any protein of choice).
- Place in sparsely oiled baking tray. Bake for 15 minutes at 350°F or until sauce clings to the chicken.

Being told about a vision one has is a delight to hear. Being able to witness that vision come to pass is marvelous to see. The augmentation of the First Church International Adult Mass Choir is a fulfillment of Pastor Jennings' vision.

On February 13, 2022, Pastor Jennings announced, "We are forming the Truth of God Adult Mass Choir...the mass choir will incorporate members from everywhere. I don't care if it's 100, 200, 300, 4. We're formulating our mass choir."

The mass choir's formation was unique in that it would consist of Truth of God members from around the world—diverse languages and multiple nationalities of one faith, singing with understanding to the glory of one God.

After a meeting during the youth conference in April 2022, Pastor appointed directors Ruth Hurd, Gino E. Jennings and Denny Mack over the choir.

What contributed to the growth of the mass choir?

I dreamt that I felt a lump in my breast and sprung out of bed. As you may know, dreams seem so real at times. So, I woke up anxious and started feeling around the same area I had felt the lump in my dream. There was nothing, or so I thought.

In that moment, I was so relieved.

"Thank you, Lord Jesus," I remarked.

It was just a dream. A terrible dream.

But for a couple of days, I couldn't shake off the dream. I would examine myself a few times, but there was nothing out of place. Then one evening while watching TV, I was prompted by, as you may have experienced, something to check.

That something impressed upon me to feel it again. So, I did.

I felt it all over and there was a lump.

Not exactly in the same area as in my
dream, but it was there. I had a lump.

I sprang up, feeling it, but disbelieving.

What was happening to me?



This was the beginning of my situation.

I was diagnosed with a malignant tumor breast cancer circa October 2011.

I underwent surgery, radiation and chemotherapy per my doctor's recommendation. But the cancer came back in my lung. Had I known then what I know now, I would not have agreed to radiation and chemo, or at least not without looking into the more natural remedies.

I was told by my oncologist that because it came back in my lung, it was automatically stage 4 breast cancer. Then, before going through radiation again to, as they say, zap the small spot on my lung, I was introduced to Bill Young, a holistic coach. Bill teaches a class at Temple University, titled "Sick of being Sick."

He helped open my eyes about the poison that had been pumped into my body and how it kills off the bad cells, but at the same time, is killing off the good. By this estimation, the probability that the treatment was leaving me at greater risk of a compromised immune system was high.

After learning these things, I changed my diet. I started and I am still taking quite a bit of vitamins daily. Lord willing, I'll add another treatment that entails minerals to help at the cellular level.

Although the last few years have been a huge struggle, I have so much to thank God for. The Lord has truly been good to me and my family. I am convinced we can all attest to the magnificence of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I do not know when, where, or how I would take my last breath. But I am praying that my soul is right with the Lord, and that He will find me worthy when He sees fit to call me out of this life. Please keep me in your prayers, and I will do likewise.

God forbid, but if anyone is diagnosed with cancer, please thoroughly research your options before deciding on a treatment. Pray and ask God to show you what to do.

The growing local congregation in Dublin, Ireland, as well as brothers and sisters from surrounding European temples, eagerly anticipate, welcome and support meetings in the area.

Ireland, colloquially known as the Emerald Island, draws its name from famously lush green territories.

Unfortunately, it is also a region with a long history of religious conflict that resulted in 1922, being divided into two distinct regions: Northern Ireland (which remains part of Great Britain) and Southern Ireland (a break away independent region, known as the Republic of Ireland).

Simplistically, the Protestants are based in the north of the island, while the majority of Catholic believers are based in the south. Much of the "troubles" associated with the 70s has diminished in recent years following the truce brokered during the Good Friday agreement.

Apostle Gino Jennings' strict, bible-based teaching emerged, offering a Scriptural

farmer and his wife, who access
services via UK Zoom meetings,
testified that they travelled three hours

"After acknowledging some of First Church's multilingual ministers, Jennings expressed the need for language translation software to cater to a broader audience, thereby furthering the growth of the church.

"We want to have captions of the different messages come across the screen in German, in Hebrew, in Latin, in Greek, in Portuguese, in Spanish, -- every language under the sun," Jennings said.

"Every single language on this planet, we want the people to hear it, and see it, and use it for God's glory."

Before going into detail about First Church's self-sufficient model, Jennings encouraged all to achieve personal development. He also urged the fathers in the crowd to have a vision for their families as the leaders and providers for their households.

The expansion of the church will involve the establishment of businesses and the implementation of a variety of programs, services and initiatives that would serve numerous purposes.

We want to expand all around the world, not just in setting up churches, but businesses," Jennings asserted. "Where we have churches, we set up businesses. That way those that are unemployed can be employed. We want to do this without borrowing one dime from any bank. I want to rid the church of borrowing from banks."

Jennings pictures the church buying vacant schools and converting them into churches and businesses -- from barbershops to laundromats, to clothing stores, to bakeries. First Church having its own educational institutions, agricultural system and trucking network is included in the vision, too.

"The Truth of God wants to be totally self-sufficient," Jennings said confidently, drawing applause from the crowd.

"We want to be able to buy all property cash, whether it's church or business.

And I can tell you how we can do it."

Pastor Jennings then pointed out an effective method to accomplish this feat. The Truth of God has more than 10,000 followers, he said. Therefore, every member sacrificing \$1,000 a year toward the newly launched First Church Expansion Program would enable the organization to build and purchase churches, establish businesses and so forth without the aid of a bank and ongoing fundraisers.

"We are talking about the Truth of God being totally dependable upon God as God works through us," Jennings said. "We, the First Church of the Lord Jesus Christ – we have a strong purchasing power."

Per his expressions, Minister Steven Williams read a passage of scripture in Deuteronomy 28 highlighting the success of the children of Israel as long as they were obedient.

"We don't only believe in meeting our spiritual needs, but we want to balance it and meet our spiritual needs and natural," Jennings stated. "Read your bible. Israel never had to go outside of Israel to do nothing."

To conclude his remarks, Jennings alluded to creating senior citizens' homes, a music school and a recording studio.

As he approaches his 40th year as pastor and general overseer of the First Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ, he has full assurance that the vision will come to pass with the church's full cooperation and willingness to follow the vision.

"This is the next phase of the vision,"
Jennings said in conclusion. "I want the
best for God's people, and I want the best
out of God's people."
